We will be leaving for our Cruise to Alaska in August. A week away sounds wonderful!! Time to relax and enjoy the sights of Alaska.


It's also time to start planning for our Grand Chapter session. Forms and information are on the web page. I hope you plan to attend our "Home Sweet Home" session.




















### FRIENDLY REMINDERS AND GRATITUDES
