

I have served on Grand Chapter Committees: Vision Committee, Chapter Concerns (3 years).



AMENDMENT TO THE CODE TO BE EFFECTIVE AT THE CONCLUSION OF 2025 GRAND CHAPTER SESSION PROPOSED CHANGES TO CODE:

SECTION 20, PAGE 11

RESTRICTIONS.

CURRENTLY READS:

No member shall hold more than one Elected office, Appointed office, District Instructor appointment, Committee Member, elected or appointed, or Grand Representative appointment in the Grand Chapter at the same time, during the same Grand Chapter year, and no officer of the Grand Chapter shall be eligible to re-election except the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer.

In no case shall any two officers of the Grand Chapter, elective or appointive, be chosen from a chapter during the same year, except chapters where the Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress shall hold membership. An exception to this being: after Grand Chapter installation of officers, one chapter with a Grand Officer makes a decision to consolidate with another chapter to which a Grand Officer belongs. If consolidation passes in both chapters, both Grand Officers may continue to serve in their respective capacities and retain membership in their chapter.

In no case shall two District Instructors be chosen form a chapter during the same year. An exception to this being where at least one of the District Instructors is a dual member of another chapter.

PROPOSED CHANGE:

It is necessary to replace the title of District Instructor to District Deputy

RATIONALE:


To have continuity in the Code, the title of District Instructor has to be changed to District Deputy

FINAL WORDING SHOWING CHANGES:

No member shall hold more than one Elected office, Appointed office, District Deputy appointment, Committee Member, elected or appointed, or Grand Representative appointment in the Grand Chapter at the same time, during the same Grand Chapter year, and no officer of the Grand Chapter shall be eligible to re-election except the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer.

In no case shall any two officers of the Grand Chapter, elective or appointive, be chosen from a chapter during the same year, except chapters where the Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress shall hold membership. AMENDMENT TO THE CODE TO BE EFFECTIVE AT THE CONCLUSION OF 2025 GRAND CHAPTER SESSION BOARD OF CUSTODIANS SECTION 43, PAGE 20

CURRENTLY READS:

A Board of Custodians consisting of the three past Grand Matrons shall have charge of the Ritualistic work, act as examiners and instructors of the District Instructors, and conduct a State School in January of each year. After each Grand Chapter Session the retiring Worthy Grand Matron shall become a member of said Board for a term of three years. Vacancies on this Board shall be filled by appointment by the Worthy Grand Matron for the unexpired term. The Board of Custodians shall examine Sisters who may apply for the Examination required for District Instructors and report their finding to the Worthy Grand Matron and the Associate Grand Matron.

PROPOSED CHANGE: The Board of Custodians will assist the Worthy Grand Matron with the Workshops. To delete "act as examiners and instructors of the District Instructors, and conduct a State School in February of each year. The Board of Custodian shall examine Sisters who may apply for the Examination required for District Instructors and report their finding to the Worthy Grand Matron and the Associate Grand Matron".

RATIONALE;

The duties of the District Instructors being changed, it is no longer necessary for the Board of Custodians to conduct a State School or hold an examination

FINAL VERSON AFTER CHANGE:

A Board of Custodians consisting of the three past Grand Matrons shall have charge of the Ritualistic work and promoting proficiency. The Board of Custodians will assist the Worthy Grand Matron with the Workshops. After each Grand Chapter Session, the retiring Worthy Grand Matron shall become a member of said Board for a term of three years. Vacancies on this Board shall be filled by appointment by the Worthy Grand Matron for the unexpired term.

When so appointed, she will receive a commission duly authenticated by the Worthy Grand Matron under the seal of the office. The District Instructors are appointed by and responsible to the Worthy Grand Matron during the term of office.

PROPOSED CHANGE:

This Section would be changed to DISTRICT DEPUTIES

The duties of the District Instructors will be deleted. The Worthy Grand Matron will be authorized to appoint District Deputies. No examination will be required.

RATIONALE:

It will not be necessary for the District Deputies be required to pass an examination.

SECTION 57, page 24, 25

DUTIES OF INSTRUCTORS

CURRENTLY READS:

Each District Instructor shall hold a District School. An Inspection Meeting may follow at the discretion of the Chapters involved in the School.

PROVIDED:

- (a) School of Instruction procedures are outlined in guidelines distributed to Chapters by the Board of Custodians who have the responsibly of governing the ritualistic work.
- (b) The Participating Chapter will share the responsibility of providing officers for the District School and/or Inspection. The Demonstrations to be covered in the School.
- (c) The Participating Chapters agree to share in any costs incurred by the host Chapters for said District School/Inspection.
- (d) The date of the School and/or inspection will be set by the Associate Grand Matron and the District Instructor's Chapters prior to her installation as Worthy Grand Matron.

The District Instructor shall attend a stated or special meeting of each Chapter in her District for the purpose of conducting a Business School of Instruction. She shall review the books and records of each Chapter in her District for the purpose of inspecting the paraphernalia as required, as well as to give instruction as may be necessary to assure conformity with the standards of Grand Chapter. The District Instructor shall conduct her School of Instruction during the months of March, April, May shall complete her work not later than June 1st of each year, but for special or emergency, the time may be extended by the Worthy Grand Matron.

It shall be the duty of the District Instructor to attend the School of Instruction and a Business School of Instruction in each of the chapters in her District. She shall be paid a stipend of \$300.00 at the completion of her duties when approved by the Worthy Grand Matron and audited by the Board of Trustees. Such payment to the District Instructor will be made by June 25th of the years the stipend was earned.

PROPOSED CHANGE:

The title of this Section would be changed to Duties of District Deputies

The District Instructors will not be instructing schools and the District Deputies will have different duties.

RATIONALE:

Over the years, the number of chapters and membership has declined. This has increased the workload of our current District Instructors. This increase has deterred some members from being willing to accept the traditional District Instructor role when asked to serve. This has resulted in less District Instructors covering a large number of chapters within an expansive district.

With this legislation the role of the District Instructor is being changed to a District Deputy. The duties and responsibilities of the District Instructor will be changed beginning with a rebranding of the name, District Deputy.

The role of the District Deputy will be to work with their assigned chapters to attend a regular stated or special meeting, review the books of the chapter, inspect the chapter paraphernalia, provide specific instruction and information given by the Worthy Grand Matron, and other various duties assigned by the Worthy Grand Matron during a given year. The District Deputy will not be responsible for holding a school(s) of instruction for their chapters. The District Deputy will serve for one year with the ability to be reappointed again. Similar to the District Instructor role, the District Deputy will still serve as a link between their assigned subordinate chapters and the Grand Chapter.

FINAL VERSION SHOWING CHANGES:

The District Deputy shall attend a stated or special meeting of each Chapter in her District for the purpose of reviewing the books and records, inspect the paraphernalia as required as well as give information as may be necessary to assure conformity with the standards of Grand Chapter. The date of the meeting will be set by the Associate Grand Matron prior to her installation as Worthy Grand Matron. and the District Deputy. The District Deputy shall conduct her duties during the months of March, April, May and shall complete her work not later than June 1st of each year, but for special or emergency, the time may be extended by the Worthy Grand Matron.



Section 14. RULES FOR ELECTION

The elective officers of the Grand Chapter shall be elected in the order in which they are named in the Constitution, and the election shall be conducted in the following manner:


The Worthy Grand Matron presides, or she may invite the Worthy Grand Patron to do so.

Three or more tellers shall have been previously appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron.

At 1:00 p.m. on the second day of the annual session, the Presiding Officer shall announce that the annual election of Grand Officers will be next in order and shall announce the officers to be *voted* upon. Each voting member shall thereupon prepare her or his ballot for the elective officer designated by the Presiding Officer. The tellers shall collect the ballots from the voters present as may be most convenient.

When the ballot has been declared closed by the Presiding Officer, the tellers shall retire to prepare their report. If, from the report of the tellers, it appears that no choice has been made for a particular office, a second or more ballots for that particular office shall be prepared and collected as in the original *vote*, and this procedure continued until a choice has been made. Members of the Grand Chapter shall not be allowed to leave their seats er carry on conversation in the Chapter room during the election of officers except by permission of the Presiding Officer and except further, that while the tellers are canvassing the vote, other business of the Grand Chapter may be conducted. Any member writing or distributing ballots for the other members to deposit or electioneering within the Grand Chapter room shall be liable to charges and any of the penalties prescribed in this Code. It shall be the duty of any member knowing of these practices to report the same to the Presiding Officer.

Any member selected for an elective position in the Grand Chapter must be present in the Grand Chapter room at the business session of the annual election of officers to accept his/her election.

3. Proposed Change(s) to the above section

ADD: "... Any candidate who has submitted her or his name for an elected office within lowa Grand Chapter may not solicit the support of, campaign for, or electioneer for the position they have submitted their name prior to or during a Grand Chapter Session. This includes any stated meeting, official visit, or any event or activity reasonably associated with lowa Eastern Star. It will not be permissible for candidates to produce any signs, brochures, or other campaign-related materials. No candidate may appoint a designee(s) to solicit support, campaign or electioneer on a candidate's behalf. Any member(s) to have been found responsible for any violations may be liable to charges or penalties prescribed in The Code."

4. Rationale for the Change(s)

Through the work of the Exploratory Committee appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron, the committee heard loud and clear from the membership regarding the concept of campaigning for an elected position in Iowa Grand Chapter. The membership shared that campaigning for any elected position should not be allowed. This was to ensure the candidate elected would be elected on her or his qualifications and merit rather than a popular vote. Per The Code, any eligible candidates' names and qualifications will be sent to chapters by the Grand Secretary's Office after August 15, annually. This is the only printed literature distributed to the membership regarding candidates that would be permissible.

The elective officers of the Grand Chapter shall be elected in the order in which they are named in the Constitution, and the election shall be conducted in the following manner:

4. Rationale for the Change(s)

For many years, Iowa Grand Chapter has followed an unwritten tradition of electing the Associate Grand Conductress from the current line of District Instructors. With the decline of chapters and membership, this has increased the workload and responsibility of current District Instructors. As a result, this has deterred members from being willing to accept the District Instructor appointment. With less District Instructors, this greatly increases the size of districts. With the steady decline of

District Instructors, this unwritten tradition is no longer a viable option to select future leaders to serve Iowa Grand Chapter. This would also allow sisters to be District Instructors without the intention or expectation to become a Grand Line Officer.

Through the work of the Exploratory Committee, the committee has met with several representatives from numerous jurisdictions to review their selection processes and took member feedback through the completed surveys. Through these discussions, the committee has developed this procedure and legislation to clearly outline to our members the process to submit eligible candidates' names to be considered for the position of Associate Grand Conductress.





RATIONALE: Through the work of the Exploratory Committee appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron, the Committee has listened to the opinions of the membership and proposed the above modification to the District Instructor role. As long as the person passes the examination to be a District Instructor, she or he should be eligible to be appointed. We have been having a difficult time getting new Instructors and by opening it up to either Sisters or Brothers, we hope to have more people willing to take on the role. 

Currently Reads:

Any living member, who according to the records in the office of the Grand Secretary, has been in affiliated good standing in the Order for a period of fifty (50) years, one or more which have been in an Iowa Chapter, but not necessarily consecutive years, either in an Iowa Chapter or other Chapters of the Order, and whose dues are not delinquent, shall be a fifty-year member, and upon written request from the Secretary of the Chapter wherein the member holds membership in Iowa, or holds their primary membership in Iowa if a <u>dual member</u>, shall, if the records so show the attainment of fifty years status, receive from the office of the Grand Secretary a fifty-year certificate, signed by the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, and attested by the Grand Secretary.

A fifty-year certificate will be issued by the Grand Chapter of Iowa to a member holding a <u>dual membership</u> when the requirements are met in the member's primary Chapter in Iowa. The <u>dual</u> secondary chapter would recognize the accomplishment of fifty years of the member. The primary chapter secretary would notify the secretary of the <u>dual</u> secondary chapter. The member shall be exempt from paying dues as stated in the last paragraph of this section 117.

Proposed Change: Change dual to "Plural".

<u>Rational</u>: At General Grand Chapter in Myrtle Beach, SC, it was passed to allow plural membership. Therefore, Dual membership needs to be changed to Plural membership.

Final Version:

Any living member, who according to the records in the office of the Grand Secretary, has been in affiliated good standing in the Order for a period of fifty (50) years, one or more which have been in an Iowa Chapter, but not necessarily consecutive years, either in an Iowa Chapter or other Chapters of the Order, and whose dues are not delinquent, shall be a fifty-year member, and upon written request from the Secretary of the Chapter wherein the member holds membership in Iowa, or holds their primary membership in Iowa if a plural member, shall, if the records so show the attainment of fifty years status, receive from the office of the Grand

Currently Reads:

- (a) No person can be elected without balloting on a petition for affiliation, dual membership, degrees or reinstatement. Balloting is done by use of white balls and black cubes. If no more than two (2) black cubes appear, the ballot is considered clear. If three (3) or more black cubes appear the ballot is destroyed and a second ballot is taken. If no more that two (2) black cubes appear on the second ballot, the ballot is considered clear. If three (3) or more black cubes appear on the second ballot, the Worthy Matron announces the results of the final ballot. The results of the second ballot shall be final. No other business shall be transacted between ballots.
- (b) At the option of the Presiding Officer, a ballot may be spread upon any number of petitions to receive the degrees, at one, and the same time, not to exceed five (5). If the ballot is found to be clear, the several petitioners shall be declared elected to receive the degrees. Should three black cubes appear in a collective ballot, the chapter shall not reject any one particular candidate. All names in the collective ballot shall be separately voted upon again at that meeting. If, upon the first separate ballot, three black cubes are cast the Presiding Officer shall not announce the results, but shall immediately order another ballot to be taken. The results shall be announced. In like manner, a group of petitions for affiliation, a group of petitions for reinstatement, and a group of petitions for dual membership may be voted upon by a collective ballot following the same procedure.

<u>Proposed Change:</u> Eliminate dual membership and insert plural membership. Eliminate the underlined words: <u>one</u>, <u>and</u> in the first sentence of paragraph (b).

EXCEPTION – A collective ballot may be spread upon any number of petitions for affiliation received at one time from members of a Chapter which has surrendered its Charter, providing they are accompanied by demits issued by the Grand Chapter of lowa within the last year. However, a collective ballot not clear shall not affect the right of any petition to be balloted upon according to paragraph (a) of this section.

<u>Proposed Change</u>: Eliminate this entire paragraph. Chapters no longer "surrender their charter". Chapters do "consolidate".

<u>Rational</u>: Since we no longer Surrender the charter, there is no reason to have this paragraph. RESTRICTIONS

CURRENTLY READS:

No member shall hold more that one Elected office, Appointed office, District Instructor appointment, Committee Member, elected or appointed, or Grand Representative appointment in the Grand Chapter at the same time, during the same Grand Chapter year, and no officer of the Grand Chapter shall be eligible to re-election except the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer.

RATIONALE:

In the past, when the Associate Grand Matron for her year as Worthy Grand Matron is choosing her appointive Grand Officers, if she wishes to appoint persons who hold membership in more than one Chapter, one of them must take a demit for the year, and then that person must petition for affiliation to rejoin the chapter they demitted out of. Plural membership wherein members may hold membership in multiple chapters causes additional work for the Grand Secretary as well as Chapter secretaries in keeping memberships in order when members must demit.

The criteria for appointments for Grand Chaplain, Grand Organist, Grand Marshal, Grand Adah, Grand Ruth, Grand Esther, Grand Martha, Grand Electa, Grand Warder, and Grand Sentinel should be allowed from plural chapters if their parent chapters are different. They should not have to demit from their plural chapters to serve one year as an Appointive Grand Officer.



Having spoken with several Grand Jurisdictions as to whether they implement an Advisory Committee composed of Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons for the purpose of

reviewing and voting upon proposed legislation prior to presenting legislation to the general membership, it was found that none of the contacted Jurisdictions follow this procedure.

Transparency is essential for the general membership. An Advisory Committee that is not representative of all of lowa's membership should have no authority to vote upon legislation ahead of the general membership and then report their vote with the purpose of influencing the vote of the membership.

The responsibility of deciding if amendments to the Constitution, Laws, and Regulations are legal should rest in the hands of the Jurisprudence Committee; it is their responsibility to review all amendments to proposed legislation and to act in an advisory capacity on any questions.

According to Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Sandy Meredith to Chapter Members in November, "It has become very difficult for our Line Officers to fill Grand Chapter appointments." It is in this capacity of service that the Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons may offer assistance and further serve Iowa Grand Chapter.

- d. Any qualified Sister serving as a District Instructor may place her name for nomination to the office of Associate Grand Conductress after completing at least three years having served as a District Instructor
- e. A Sister so appointed as a District Instructor must be a present or Past Matron of a Subordinate Chapter within the district in which she is to serve and having served as an appointed Grand Officer.
- f. When so appointed, she will receive a commission duly authenticated by the Worthy Grand Matron and under the Seal of her office.
- g. If a District Instructor reaches the position of number 5 in the line of Instructors, she may decide not to seek the office of Associate Grand Conductress, but may wish to continue instructing. In this case the Associate Grand Matron may appoint her to instruct but will place her at the last position in the District Instructor's line.'

RATIONALE:

This will allow a greater pool of qualified sisters for election as Associate Grand Conductress. This will also allow the Associate Grand Matron to continue to appoint new instructors.


It will also give the instructors the opportunity to continue instructing, pending reappointment, allowing them the option of throwing their hat in the ring, or to go to the end of the line upon reaching the number 5 position in the District Instructors line and continue in their instructing role.

It gives any sister the opportunity to place their name in Nomination for the office of Associate Grand Conductress, provided they have at least three years of service as an instructor having proved their proficiency in the work of the Order.

It makes it clear that the appointment to the position of District Instructor is a one year appointment, with the Associate Grand Matron retaining the right to reappoint any instructor after taking into account her ability to instruct and knowledge of the work.


District Schools haven't been successful, with attendance, with sustaining proficiency, or with gaining new instructors and maintaining proficiency of instructors.

Assigning Districts and then having chapters conform, is not working, causing hard feelings, causing low attendance by officers, creating travel distance complaints, and decreasing proficiency.

Schools should not be longer than 4 hours. Our membership does not want to and should not be expected to spend an entire day at a School.

Members should not be expected to travel more than 1 ½ hours to their own School unless their Chapter members request to do so.

With District Schools very few members actually do the work. We learn more by doing, rather than by watching.



Division II: Grand Chapter

Section 17: Elective Officers and Board Members

<u>Currently Reads:</u> It may be permissible for a Worthy Matron or a Past Matron or a Worthy Patron or a Past Patron of an Iowa Chapter to submit to the Grand Secretary's office her/his name and qualifications for any elective position. Names of nominees other than self shall be accompanied by written consent of nominee. Names shall be in the Grand Secretary's office at least ninety (90) days before the formal opening of Grand Chapter. Said names and qualifications shall be sent to Chapters along with the proposed legislation after August 15th of each year and shall be announced immediately prior to the election.

Proposed Change: Eliminate "after August 15th of each year" and insert: "60 days before the formal opening of Grand Chapter".

Rational: If Grand Chapter should change when it is held, this section would again need to be rewritten. If it is 60 days prior to the opening of Grand Chapter, there would not need to be any rewriting of this Section. Also, the 30 days difference from receipt of legislation and name consideration and when it is sent out to chapters, will allow time if the jurisprudence committee needs to review legislation.

Final Version: It may be permissible for a Worthy Matron or a Past Matron or a Worthy Patron or a Past Patron of an Iowa Chapter to submit to the Grand Secretary's office her/his name and qualifications for any elective position. Names of nominees other than self shall be accompanied by written consent of nominee. Names shall be in the Grand Secretary's office at least ninety (90) days before the formal opening of Grand Chapter. Said names and qualifications shall be sent to Chapters along with the proposed legislation sixty (60) days before the formal opening of Grand Chapter and shall be announced immediately prior to the election.
